



Name Writing Practice

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How it works: ① A grown-up writes the child's name in the first strip with a **highlighter or yellow marker** – big letters, capital first, then lowercase. ② Your child traces right over the highlighter letters in the next strips. ③ In the last strips, they write it all by themselves. Wobbly is wonderful – celebrate every attempt!

Tips: capitals-then-lowercase ("Maya", not "MAYA") is what kindergarten teachers hope to see. Keep sessions to 5 minutes, stop while it's still fun, and let them trace with a finger first – in a salt tray or a letter-tracing app – before picking up the pencil.



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Warm-up: trace the hollow letters

Start with the letters in your child's name, then explore the rest. Finger first, then crayon or pencil – stay inside the outlines!
